We are very happy to take notes such as booking in for After School Club or child not feeling great/ happy to pass on to the class teacher, plus any paperwork for the school office, such as lunch orders – which often get hidden in book bags. Several children have large rucksacks, which are not designed for school pegs, and these are often full of unread letters or post. Staff are not expected to check these, especially in Badger and Owl classes.

Rabbits are busy learning about themselves, their new class and the school. They have settled into school very quickly and the daily routines are already established. Reading books are sent home daily. Please share the book with your child and write a comment in their reading record. Phonics, handwriting exercises and maths games will be coming home soon. The **Squirrel Class** will be studying the Great Fire of London this term. I am very excited about teaching the Squirrel Class and working with you. We will have PE on a Monday and Wednesday. Please encourage your child to read daily. The children will be bringing home spellings and times tables. I loved the reading the summer projects and hearing about your break. Thank you for completing these. As **writers** we will be writing a story in a familiar setting based on 'Knuffle Bunny'. We will also be writing a historical recount in the form of a diary entry based on the Great fire of London. As **mathematicians** we will be focussing on number and place value and addition and subtraction. In **science** we will be looking at living things and their habitats, so we will be spending some time outside, looking at the habitats we have in the school grounds. As historians we will be looking at the impact that the Great fire of London had on people's lives and how fire safety has changed through time. Though our **geography** we will be learning about the United Kingdom, locating where each country is. Please come and talk to me after school if you have any worries. Miss Petch

Welcome to **Badger Class**, the children have settled in really well and are very excited about the term ahead. Our topic this term is India, in particular we are thinking about the question, How does the Physical and Human Geography of India compare to the UK? We will be embracing the topic in many of our subjects including R.E, Art, D.T and English. The children have already started to learn the story The Tiger Child, a traditional Indian folk story. In Art we will be investigating and trying our hand at a variety of Indian art such as Rangoli patterns, Mehndi and patterns on Indian clothing with block printing. We will also discover the significance of Peacocks and the Taj Mahol. Don't forget we are swimming every Monday this term and we will also have P.E lessons on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons, please can you make sure your child has the appropriate kit in school on those days. Spellings have been set today and will be tested next Monday. Last week your child brought home a class newsletter, learning web and a knowledge organiser, these outline what happens in Badger Class and give you an idea as to what the children will be learning. Also look out for our class Badger, he will be visiting all the children over the year and has had his first adventure this weekend.



Owls are pleased to be back and ready to learn!

Our first topic this term is 'The Victorians'. During this theme we will be developing our understanding of life in the Victorian times, improving our map skills whilst learning about Victorian empires around the World, using research skills and applying our non-fiction writing skills. A medium term plan showing what will be covered in each subject is attached. You can also find copies of this on the school website. We have a topic display in our classroom and we would really appreciate any additional work your children have done at home to add to this display (such as artwork based on the Victorians, fictional stories they have written, research projects they have done, timelines they have made, photos from places they have visited or things they have made, etc.). This year, we will be giving the children knowledge organisers for each topic. This contains some of the key knowledge that will help them to achieve well in their topic learning. We would greatly appreciate you spending a few minutes going through this with your children at home. They will have a second copy of this to keep in school. If you have any questions, please ask me after school. I am looking forward to another exciting year in Owl Class. Mrs Smithson
